Internet Safety Tips for Kids

- <u>Do not</u> post personal information online (name, age, birth date, address, telephone number, or school name). This information can be used by others to find out where you and your family live.
- <u>Do not</u> post your picture online it can be copied or changed or used to find you.
- <u>Do not</u> post your plans and activities in a chat room or on your personal website.
- <u>Do not</u> communicate with someone who has made you uncomfortable or afraid. Tell your parents or a trusted adult if someone does.
- <u>Do not</u> meet with someone you met online without first telling your parents or guardian.
- Do not respond to hurtful or inappropriate messages.
- <u>Do</u> remember that people can lie online and say they are something they are not. Someone who says they are a 12-year-old girl could really be an older man looking to harm you.
- ✓ Do save messages that upset you and show them to your parents.
- <u>Do</u> share your password with your parents.
