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## United Against Hate School Presentation Request Form

Thank you for your interest in the U.S. Attorney's Office's <u>United Against Hate</u> program. This program consists of an interactive presentation by attorneys from the U.S. Attorney's Office and special agents from the FBI. Students will learn how to distinguish a hate crime from civil discrimination or other bias incidents; what hate crimes laws exist and why; and how to report potential hate crimes or discrimination to law enforcement.

Although we can make some modifications to the presentation for different environments, we have found through past experiences that the program works best in the following conditions:

- Provide about 90 minutes (minimum of 60) for the presentation and questions.
- Ideal audience size is ~50-100 students.
- It is helpful but not necessary for students to have some background in U.S. government and/or our legal system. For that reason, the presentation may be best for juniors and seniors; those enrolled in a government course; and/or members of student groups interested in civil rights enforcement. However, all are welcome.
