


Operation LeGend in Memphis

(Incidents Per 100,000 Population and Numbers)¹



(RATE PER 100,000 POPULATION AND NUMBERS)¹





● City of Memphis ● All of Shelby County



GULF COAST REGIONAL FUGITIVE TASK FORCE




Operation Relentless Pursuit January 13-April 3, 2020

“Operation Relentless Pursuit” - a targeted enforcement operation with a focus on fugitives wanted for the most serious, violent, and harmful offenses, including homicide, forcible sexual assault, robbery, and aggravated assault.

During this ongoing operation, **480** arrest warrants were cleared, **434** individuals were arrested, including 24 wanted for homicide, 151 for assault or robbery, 75 wanted for sexual offenses, and 61 identified gang members. Seized during this time period were ninety (90) firearms; four (4) vehicles; 20.71 kilograms of narcotics; and approximately \$51,000 in U.S. currency.

The FBI is offering a reward of up to \$25,000 for information leading to the identification and arrest of the individual(s) responsible for the homicides of LeQuan Dequez Boyd and Ashlynn Denae' Lockett.

DETAILS

The Federal Bureau of Investigation's Memphis Field Office, federal partners, and the Memphis Police Department in Tennessee are seeking the public's assistance in identifying the individual(s) responsible for the deaths of Ashlynn Denae' Lockett and LeQuan Dequez Boyd on January 20, 2020.

On the night of January 20, 2020, Memphis police officers reported to a shooting at a Hickory Hill residence in Memphis, Tennessee. When police arrived on the scene, they found six-year-old Ashlynn Lockett and sixteen-year-old LeQuan Boyd had been struck by gunfire while they were inside their home. Lockett and Boyd were transported to local hospitals, where they both died as a result of their injuries.
