All in violation Title 14, United States Code, Section 521(c) and Title 18, United States Code, Section 2.

I. INTRODUCTION

6 1. I, Evan Sanborn, am a Special Agent with the United States Coast Guard 7 Investigative Service (CGIS), and have been so employed since September 2010. 8 Currently, I am assigned to the CGIS Northwest Region in Seattle, Washington. I have 9 been an active duty United States Coast Guard member for over 20 years, and have participated in multiple aspects of federal law enforcement within that timeframe. In my 10 11 official capacity as a CGIS Special Agent, I have investigated violations of federal and 12 state law along with violations of the Uniform Code of Military Justice. My training 13 includes attending both the Criminal Investigators Training Program at the Federal Law 14 Enforcement Training Center and the Naval Criminal Investigative Service's Special 15 Agent Basic Training Program. As part of my duties as a CGIS Special Agent, I have previously investigated Search and Rescue hoaxes and reports of false distress. 16

II. <u>PURPOSE OF THE AFFIDAVIT</u>

2. The facts set forth in this Complaint are based on the following: my personal and direct participation in the investigation, my experience and training as a CGIS Special Agent, my conversations with witnesses and other law enforcement personnel participating in this and related investigations, and my review of relevant documents and reports.

3. Because this Affidavit is submitted for the limited purpose of establishing
probable cause, it does not set forth each and every fact that I or others have learned
during the course of this investigation. I have set forth only those facts that I believe are
relevant to the determination of probable cause to believe that RYEN ETHAN BELL and
DEVIN MITCHELL SCHMIDT committed the crime of Knowingly Communicating and
did aid and abet the communication of a False Distress Message to the U.S. Coast Guard,

in violation Title 14, United States Code, Section 521(c) and Title 18, United States Code, Section 2.

III. SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATION

4. On December 18, 2019, RYEN ETHAN BELL falsely reported to the Port Townsend Police Department that his cousin and Soldier in the United States Army, DEVIN MITCHELL SCHMIDT was missing and possibly dead by suicide. BELL reported to police that he received a suicide video from SCHMIDT, which appeared to be recorded from Fort Worden Historical State Park (Fort Worden) in Port Townsend, Washington, earlier that day. BELL also provided the police with a text message he received from SCHMIDT at approximately 1:15 p.m. The message was a self-filmed suicide video of SCHMIDT saying goodbye to his family and informing them that he would soon be deceased.

5. BELL's report to authorities resulted in an extensive search for SCHMIDT by the Port Townsend Police, Jefferson County Sherriff's Office, U.S. Army personnel, and the United States Coast Guard. The United States Coast Guard expended approximately \$172,361.50 in resources, to include marine vessels, helicopters, and drones to attempt to locate SCHMIDT.

6. On the afternoon of December 19, 2019, the police determined that BELL had made false statements about the whereabouts of SCHMIDT, that SCHMIDT had faked his suicide, and discovered SCHMIDT alive. BELL and SCHMIDT each voluntarily admitted to police that they agreed to falsely report the suicide on December 18, 2019, at Fort Worden cliffs to evade military charges, causing the Coast Guard to conduct an extensive search for SCHMIDT. Pertinent statements by witnesses interviewed are further summarized below.

7. RYEN ETHAN BELL is a 21-year-old male and his last known residence was in Bonney Lake, Washington.

8. DEVIN MITCHELL SCHMIDT is a 20-year-old male who was previously in the U.S. Army with the rank of Private (E-1), and was stationed at Joint Base Lewis McChord (JBLM), Washington. He was charged under the Uniform Code of Military Justice but agreed to an Other than Honorable Discharge in exchange for being administratively separated from the military without a criminal conviction, effective March 27, 2020. He is currently believed to be residing with his family in Washington.

A. Agreement and Concealment

9. During the day of December 17, 2019, SCHMIDT and BELL travelled to their grandparents' home. SCHMIDT and BELL are first-cousins. SCHMIDT claims BELL's residence in Bonney Lake, Washington, as his current mailing address, as SCHMIDT is reportedly estranged from this biological parents who reside in Port Townsend, Washington. After leaving their grandparents' home, SCHMIDT and BELL went to their friend Samuel Gold's house in Puyallup, Washington. There, SCHMIDT told BELL his plan to fake his own death and travel to Mexico to avoid returning to the military. BELL agreed to assist SCHMIDT in his plan to falsely report or cause the false reporting of SCHMIDT's death to law enforcement including the U.S. Coast Guard.

10. On December 18, 2019, pursuant to the plan, SCHMIDT failed to report for military duty at 6:30 a.m. on JBLM. Instead, SCHMIDT snuck into BELL's home that he shared with his mother, Bambi Bell, in Bonney Lake, Washington. BELL was aware SCHMIDT was in the home, but both were careful to conceal SCHMIDT's presence from BELL's mother.

11. BELL and his mother then separately departed the residence. SCHMIDT called BELL at 9:15 a.m. to request \$150.00. Once he received the money, SCHMIDT then hired an Uber driver to transport him from BELL's home to Fort Worden, which totaled \$144.66 for the trip. SCHMIDT arrived at Fort Worden at 9:31 a.m. and filmed a video of himself using his cell phone. In the video, SCHMIDT stated:

"I guess if you're watching this, I'm no longer alive. I can't... I haven't been living the life I wanted to live. I've been too depressed lately. I just felt lost. I just want you guys to know I love all of you. I know you guys won't forget about me. Don't tear your own lives apart for it. Sorry. While I'm gone I want somebody to watch over my brother. And Ryen, I

want you to go to all the places I wanted to go, and leave a memory for me there. Love you guys."

SCHMIDT sent the video via text message to BELL at 1:15 p.m.

12. BELL received and watched the video. Knowing SCHMIDT was alive and not the victim of suicide, BELL notified his ex-girlfriend, Hallie Lubahn, of the alleged suicide without revealing the hoax to her. BELL and Lubahn drove to Fort Worden under the auspices of searching for SCHMIDT. BELL found SCHMIDT's Army dog tags, unlocked cell phone, and cell phone charger on a bluff above a cliff at Fort Worden. The cliff was approximately 100-150 feet high and dropped into a small area of eroded land before dropping into Puget Sound. The amount of eroded land varies depending on the tides.

 knowing SCHMIDT was alive and knowing SCHMIDT's parents would report the false
 distress message to law enforcement, including the U.S. Coast Guard. BELL also knew
 his false report to SCHMIDT's parents would cause law enforcement, including the U.S.
 Coast Guard to attempt to save SCHMIDT's life, when no help was needed because
 SCHMIDT had faked his death by suicide.

7 14. BELL's mother, Bambi Bell, called 911 emergency dispatch at 4:58 p.m.,
8 after BELL told her that he received the suicide video from SCHMIDT. BELL then went
9 to the Port Townsend Police Office at his mother's direction.

10 15. Officer Troy Surber of the Port Townsend Police Office took BELL's
missing person report at 5:40 p.m. BELL gave a verbal and written statement detailing
the suicide video and the discovery of SCHMIDT's items above the cliff at Fort Worden
in an attempt to mislead law enforcement about SCHMIDT's death. BELL told Officer
Surber that he and H.L. had searched the area for SCHMIDT without success, including
the cliff area at Fort Worden.

16 16. On the evening of December 18, 2019, Officer Surber contacted Jefferson
17 County Sherriff's Office and requested assistance with the search. Law enforcement
18 organized search teams and began a search plan, but determined the search would have to
19 begin the following morning due to severe weather in the area and darkness. Based on
20 the location where SCHMIDT was believed to have committed suicide by jumping from
21 the cliff into the water below, Jefferson County notified the U.S. Coast Guard.

B. The Search

22

17. At approximately 6:32 a.m., on December 19, 2019, U.S. Coast Guard
Sector Puget Sound received a request from the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office to
support a multi-agency Search and Rescue effort for SCHMIDT, which focused on the
land and sea area surrounding Fort Worden, Port Townsend.

18. Coast Guard Search and Rescue efforts continued for approximately 10
hours until the search was terminated at 4:00 p.m. on December 19, 2019. Responding

assets included a Coast Guard H-65 and U.S Navy H-60 helicopters, two Coast Guard 87'
Patrol Boats (WPB), and a Coast Guard 45' Response Boat Medium (RBM). Weather
conditions during the 10 hours of CG response were poor for both maritime and air
assets; the National Weather Service reported moderate to heavy precipitation, with wind
gusts from 20-40 MPH, and low visibility. Ultimately, the Coast Guard expended
approximately \$172,035.00 (including \$46,626.00 in U.S. Navy maritime assets)
searching for SCHMIDT, prior to search termination.

C.

Witness Interviews and Discovery of SCHMIDT

9 19. At 4:00 p.m., the Search and Rescue team gave a post-search debrief to the
10 SCHMIDT and BELL families, to include SCHMIDT's biological parents, at Fort
11 Worden, which included information about SCHMIDT's last known movements via
12 Uber. During that debriefing, Bambi Bell notified police that BELL told her conflicting
13 information about SCHMIDT's Uber trip on the morning of December 18, 2019.

20. Bambi Bell revealed she was now suspicious of BELL after he had reported
SCHMIDT missing to her at approximately 9:14 a.m. on December 18, 2019, four hours
before the suicide video was sent to BELL by SCHMIDT. Bambi Bell suspected that
SCHMIDT had been at her residence on the morning of December 2019, but BELL
continued to deny SCHMIDT had been present. Bambi Bell told police SCHMIDT
previously asked her about what she would do if SCHMIDT went "AWOL," a military
term used to describe Absent Without Leave.

21 21. A police interview of Casey Crawford, a friend of BELL and SCHMIDT, 22 revealed that during the search effort, BELL showed Crawford a Facebook Messenger 23 communication on his cell phone from a "Jake Elbstein." The message requested BELL 24 meet him at 6:00 p.m., on December 19, 2019, at a McDonald's restaurant in Port Townsend. After showing Crawford the communication, BELL said, "[t]his must be first 25 contact." Crawford believed the communication was from SCHMIDT, and that the name 26 "Jake Elbstein" was fictitious. Crawford stated he initially viewed SCHMIDT's "suicide 27 video" on the evening of December 18, 2019, after BELL had forwarded the video to 28

Samuel Gold, with the instructions to only show Crawford the video. Crawford stated
 that BELL specifically told Crawford and Gold not to help in the search effort for
 SCHMIDT. Crawford stated that he, SCHMIDT, BELL, and Gold had previously
 discussed faking their deaths to allow SCHMIDT and Gold to leave the U.S. Army so
 they could travel to Mexico to "fight cartels" as "freelance fighters."

22. Based on the information obtained from Crawford, police seized BELL's cell phone as evidence and set up a surveillance at the McDonald's restaurant in Port Townsend. At approximately 5:55 p.m., SCHMIDT arrived at the McDonald's restaurant and was taken into custody. BELL was also taken into custody.

SCHMIDT and BELL Admissions

11 23. During a Mirandized interview, SCHMIDT acknowledged that he was 12 aware of the search efforts, stating that he "couldn't take it off my fucking mind while I 13 was out there." SCHMIDT spent the night of December 18, 2019, in a portable restroom 14 at the Haines Place Park and Ride in Port Townsend, Washington. On the morning of 15 December 19, 2019, SCHMIDT admitted to sneaking into his mother's residence in Port 16 Townsend, Washington, and using her computer to create a fictitious Facebook account 17 under the name "Jake Elbstein." At 3:00 p.m. on 19 December, 2019, SCHMIDT sent 18 BELL the message to meet at 6:00 p.m. at the McDonald's restaurant in Port Townsend. 19 SCHMIDT stated that he immediately deleted the fictitious Facebook account after 20 sending BELL the message. SCHMIDT admitted that BELL had agreed to assist with the plan to fake SCHMIDT's death and report or cause the false report to law 21 enforcement including the U.S. Coast Guard. SCHMIDT called this initial suicide hoax 22 23 "phase one" of his plan to evade military authority and travel to Mexico.

24 24. During a *Mirandized* interview, BELL admitted to having prior knowledge
25 of SCHMIDT's plan to fake his own death and "disappear." BELL stated that
26 SCHMIDT "dropped" it on him on December 17, 2019. BELL stated that he went along
27 with the plan because he is a loyal lifelong friend and he knew that SCHMIDT was going
28 to do it with or without him. BELL admitted that he continued to help the U.S. Coast

 Guard and authorities search for SCHMIDT knowing he would not be found. BELL
 believed that they had successfully misled authorities until Bambi Bell notified police of her suspicions.

IV. CONCLUSION

5 25. Based on the aforementioned facts, I believe probable cause exists that
6 Ryen BELL and Devin SCHMIDT committed the crimes of knowingly and unlawfully
7 communicating, and aiding and abetting the communication of, a false distress message
8 to the United States Coast Guard and cause the United States Coast Guard to attempt to
9 save lives, when no help was needed, by faking the death by suicide of DEVIN
10 MITCHELL SCHMIDT.

11All in violation Title 14, United States Code, Section 521(c) and Title 18, United12States Code, Section 2.
