The defendant having waived in open court prosecution by Indictment, the United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey charges:

From in or around February 2013 through in or around March 2014, in Monmouth and Ocean Counties, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, the defendant,

RICHARD DURHAM

did knowingly and intentionally conspire and agree with Rufus Young, a/k/a "Equan," a/k/a "E-Money," and others to distribute and to possess with intent to distribute a quantity of a mixture and substance containing a detectable amount of heroin, a schedule I controlled substance, contrary to Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1) and (b)(1)(C).

In violation of Title 21, United States Code, Section 846.

FORFEITURE ALLEGATION

The allegation contained in this Information is hereby realleged and incorporated by reference for the purpose of noticing forfeiture pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853.

The United States hereby gives notice to the defendant charged in this Information that, upon conviction of the offense alleged in this Information, the government will seek forfeiture in accordance with Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(a), which requires any person convicted of such offense to forfeit any property constituting, or derived from, proceeds obtained, directly or indirectly, as a result of such offense, and any property used, or intended to be used, in any manner or part, to commit, or to facilitate the commission of such offense.

If any of the above-described forfeitable property, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:

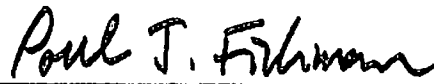
(a) cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;

(b) has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third party;

(c) has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the court;

(d) has been substantially diminished in value; or

(e) has been commingled with other property which cannot be divided without difficulty;
it is the intent of the United States, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(p), to seek forfeiture of any other property of the defendant up to the value of the forfeitable property described in this forfeiture allegation.
