The Grand Jury charges:

1. On or about December 19, 2011, in the Southern District of New York, ANTONIO OLMEDA, the defendant, after having been convicted in a court of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, knowingly did possess in and affecting commerce firearms, to wit, a Springfield Armory Ultra Compact .45-caliber semi-automatic handgun and a Taurus 85 Ultralite .38-caliber revolver, which previously had been shipped and transported in interstate commerce.

(Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(g)(1).)

COUNT TWO

The Grand Jury further charges:

2. On or about December 19, 2011, in the Southern District of New York, ANTONIO OLMEDA, the defendant, after having been convicted in a court of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, knowingly did possess in and affecting commerce firearms, to wit, an Olympic Arms PCR03 .223-caliber

fully-automatic rifle, a Smith & Wesson .40-caliber semi-automatic pistol, a Beretta 92SB Compact 9-mm Luger semi-automatic pistol, and a Cobray Industries M-11 9-mm Luger fully-automatic pistol, which previously had been shipped and transported in interstate commerce.

(Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(g)(1).)

COUNT THREE

The Grand Jury further charges:

3. On or about December 19, 2011, in the Southern District of New York, ANTONIO OLMEDA, the defendant, knowingly did receive and possess firearms which were not registered to him in the National Firearms Registration and Transfer Record, to wit, an Olympic Arms PCR03 .223-caliber fully-automatic rifle and a Cobray Industries M-11 9-mm Luger fully-automatic pistol, which are weapons that shoot, are designed to shoot, and can be readily restored to shoot, automatically more than one shot, without manual reloading, by a single function of the trigger.

(Title 26, United States Code, Sections 5845(b) and 5861(d).)

COUNT FOUR

The Grand Jury further charges:

4. In or about 2011, in the Southern District of New York, ANTONIO OLMEDA, the defendant, after having been convicted in a court of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, knowingly did possess in and affecting commerce

firearms, to wit, a Remington model Mohawk 600 .308-caliber rifle, a Roggio Arsenal model RA-15 rifle receiver/frame, an Interarms rifle, three Springfield Armory model 1911A1 .45-caliber pistols, a Sig Sauer model SP 2022 9mm-caliber pistol, a Taurus model PT140 Millenium .40-caliber pistol, a Smith & Wesson model 4006 .40-caliber pistol, a Star Bonifacio Echeverria model Firestar 9mm-caliber pistol, a Charter Arms model Police Undercover .32-caliber revolver, a Walther model PPK/S .380-caliber pistol, a Vulcan Arms model V15 7.62x39mm-caliber machinegun, a Norinco AK-type 7.62x39mm-caliber machinegun, and a Mossberg model 500A 12-gauge shotgun, which previously had been shipped and transported in interstate commerce.

(Title 18, United States Ccde, Section 922(g)(1).)

COUNT FIVE

The Grand Jury further charges:

5. In or about 2011, in the Southern District of New York, ANTONIO OLMEDA, the defendant, knowingly did receive and possess firearms which were not registered to him in the National Firearms Registration and Transfer Record, to wit, a Vulcan Arms model V15 7.62x39mm-caliber machinegun and a Norinco AK-type 7.62x39mm-caliber machinegun, which are weapons that shoot, are

designed to shoot, and can be readily restored to shoot, automatically more than one shot, without manual reloading, by a single function of the trigger.

(Title 26, United States Code, Sections 5845(b) and 5861(d).)


COUNT SIX

The Grand Jury further charges:

6. In or about 2011, in the Southern District of New York, ANTONIO OLMEDA, the defendant, knowingly did receive and possess firearms which were not registered to him in the National Firearms Registration and Transfer Record, to wit, a Mossberg Model 500A 12-gauge shotgun, which is a weapon made from a shotgun which weapon as modified has an overall length of less than 26 inches and a barrel and barrels of less than 18 inches in length.

(Title 26, United States Code, Sections 5845(a)(2) and 5861(d).)
